The very first bill Governor Sununu ever signed into law allows dangerous individuals to legally carry hidden, loaded weapons. **Senators Ruth Ward** (R-Stoddard), **Harold French** (R-Franklin), **John Reagan** (R-Deerfield), and **Bob Giuda** (R-Warren) all supported this measure, as well as refused to ban dangerous bump stocks or support gun free school zones.

Senators Dan Feltes (D-Concord) and **Kevin Cavanaugh** (D-Manchester), however, supported public safety with each vote they cast. (*Note: Cavanaugh was not yet elected during the vote on SB 12 and was absent during SB 357, but did vote to prohibit dangerous bump stocks, like the ones from the Las Vegas shooting.*)
