The very first bill **Governor Sununu** ever signed into law allows dangerous individuals to legally carry hidden, loaded weapons. **Senators Dan Innis** (R-New Castle), **Bill Gannon** (R-Sandown), **Regina Birdsell** (R-Hampstead), **Sharon Carson** (R-Londonderry), **John Reagan** (R-Deerfield), and **Chuck Morse** (R-Salem) all sponsored this measure, as well as refused to ban dangerous bump stocks or support gun free school zones.

Senators Martha Fuller Clark (D-Portsmouth) and **Kevin Cavanaugh** (D-Manchester), however, supported public safety with each vote they cast. (*Note: Cavanaugh was not yet elected during the vote on SB 12 and was absent during SB 357, but voted to prohibit dangerous bump stocks like the ones from the Las Vegas shooting.*) Contact Governor Sununu at (603) 271-2121.
