The very first bill **Governor Sununu** ever signed into law allows dangerous individuals to legally carry hidden, loaded weapons. **Senator Ruth Ward** (R-Stoddard) sponsored this measure, as well as refused to ban dangerous bump stocks or support gun free school zones. **Senator Martha Hennessey** (D-Hanover), however, supported public safety with each vote and also sponsored the gun free schools bill.
